There are 163 web pages (plus some hidden pages) on survey research topics, some of which contain links to pages and/or files on this site or on other sites.

In addition to any information on the web pages themselves, there are more than 750 pages of tutorials.

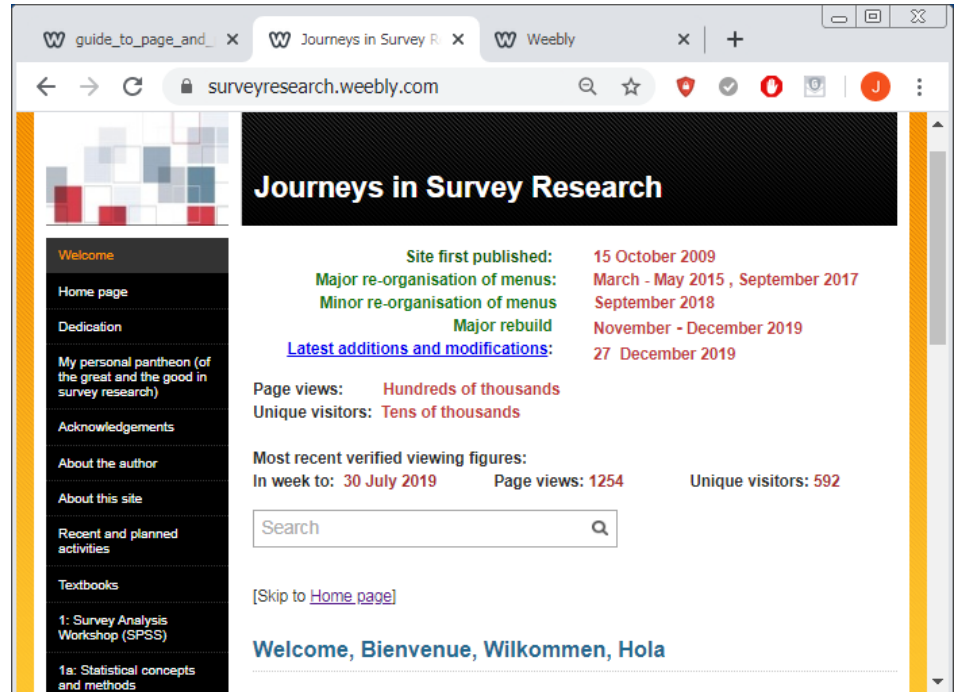
Most of the **files** on this site are SPSS tutorials, reports, questionnaires or other documents in **.pdf** format. They progress gently step-by-step with full colour screenshots at each step. Even if you do not have access to SPSS, you should be able to easily follow and understand them.

Some files are **raw data files** in **.txt** format (extracted from actual surveys). Others are SPSS syntax files **.sps**, SPSS saved files **.sav** or SPSS viewer files **.spv**. Some files are **slide-shows** in **.ppt** format and one or two are **Excel files** in **.xlsx** format.

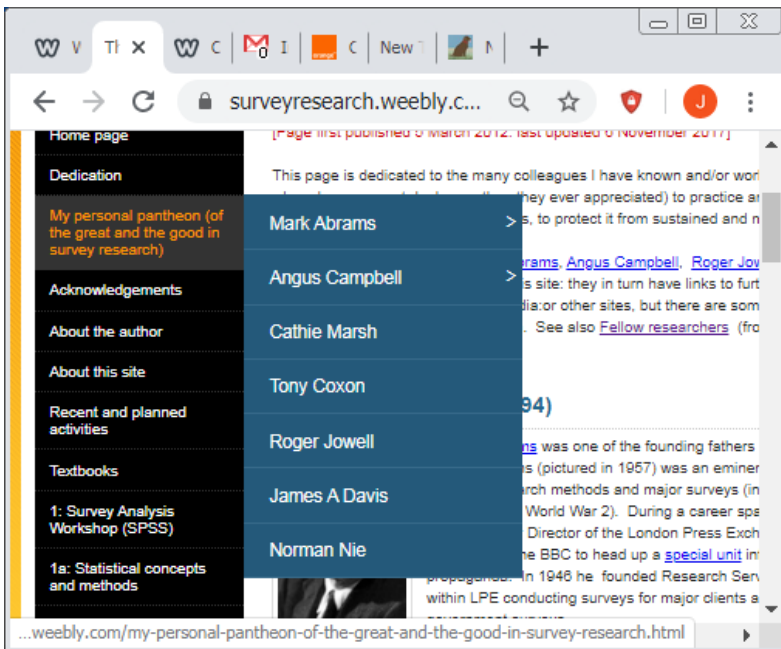

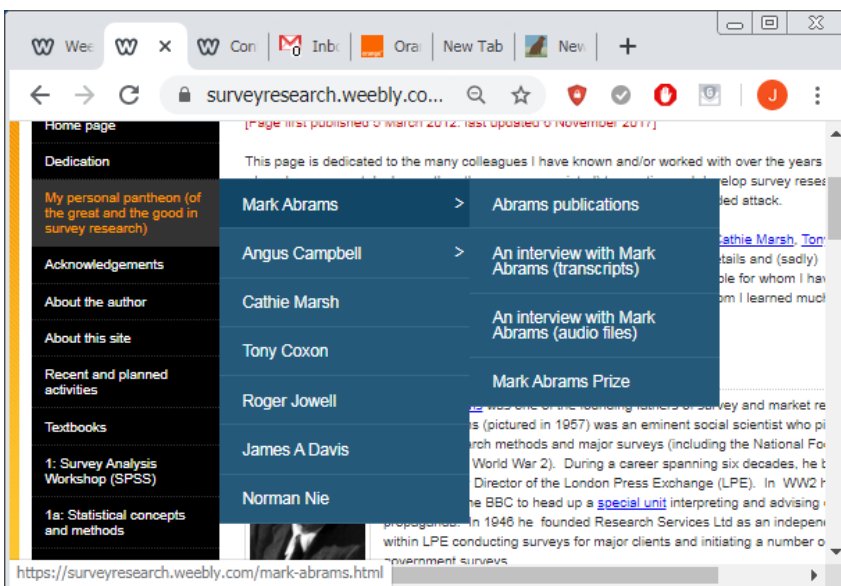
Hovering over menus releases pop-out sub-menus (if any): these pop out very quickly, especially if your mouse tends to wander!

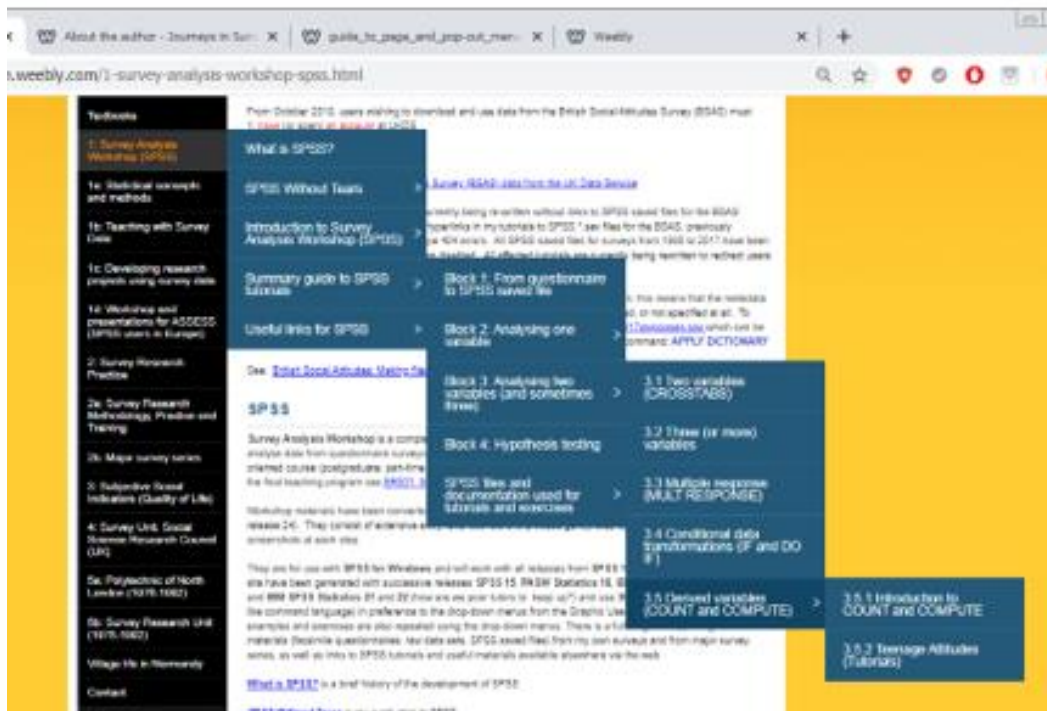


Clicking on a menu will display the appropriate page in a new window. Contents of pages are **different** from the contents of pages accessed via sub-menus.

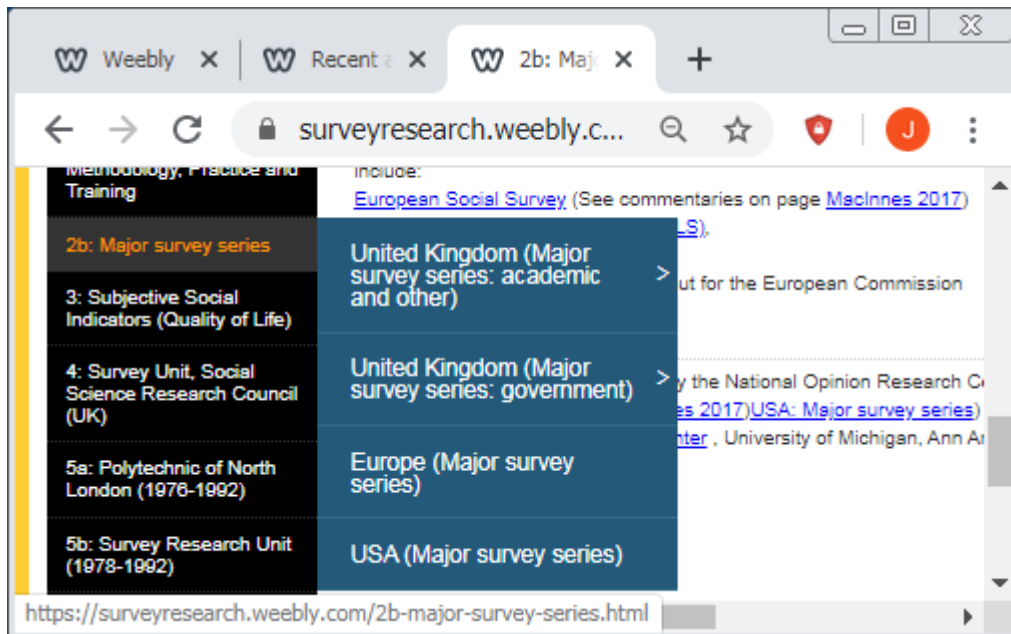

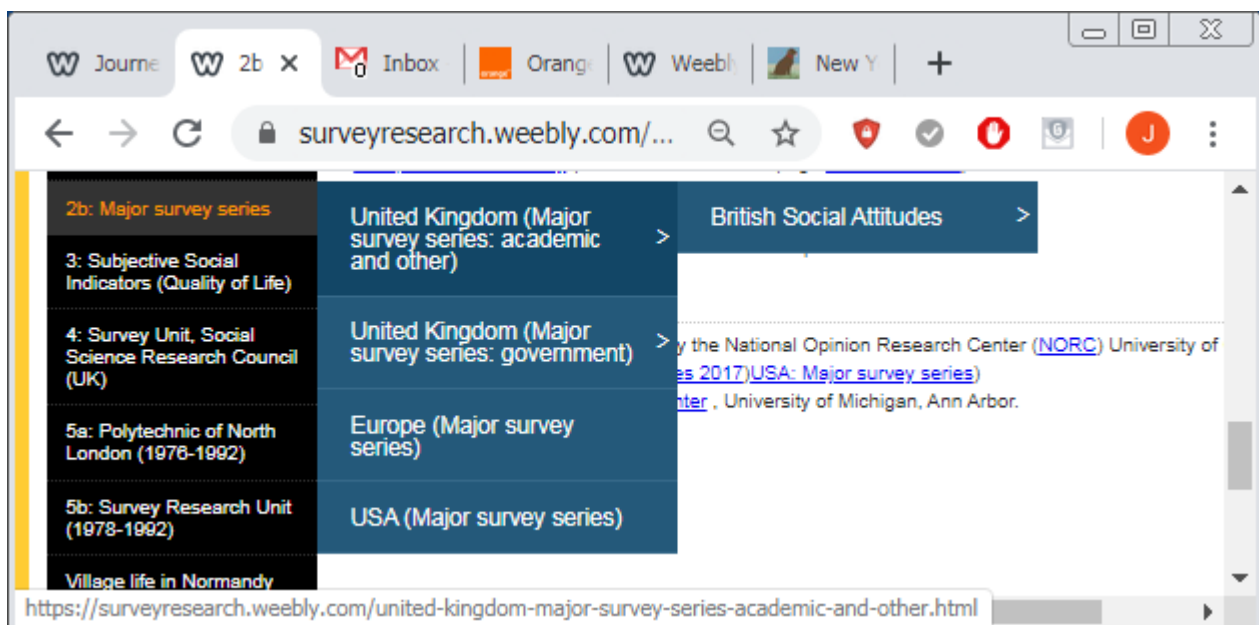

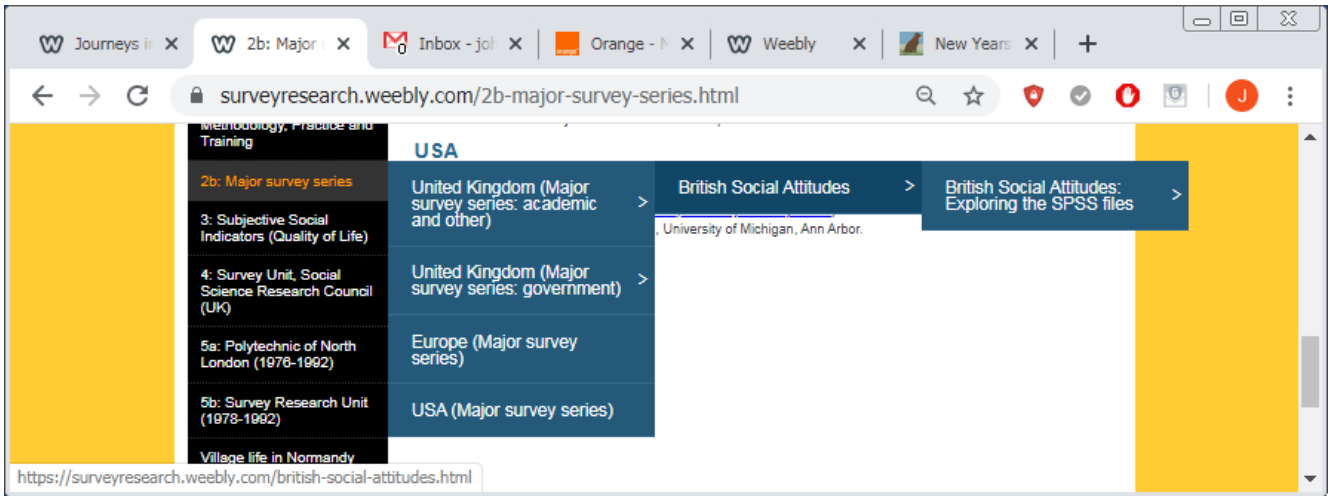

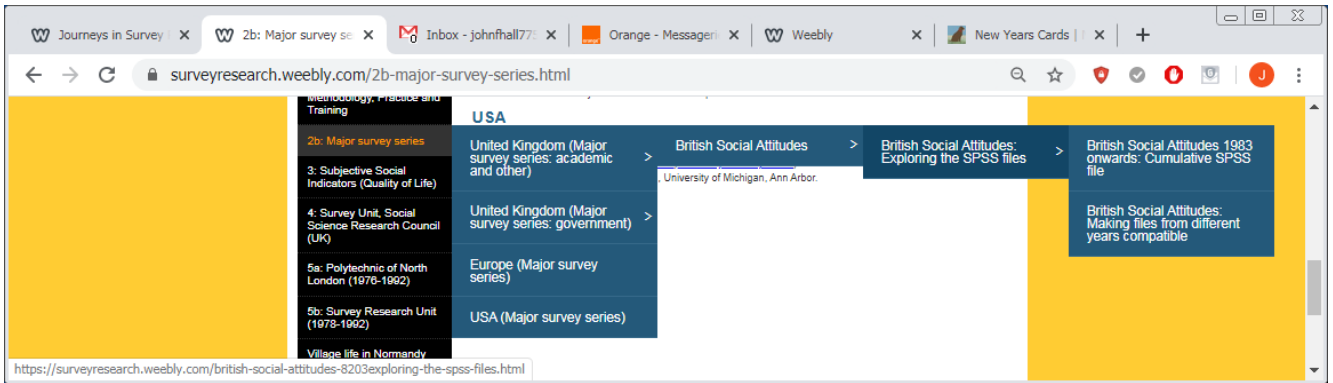

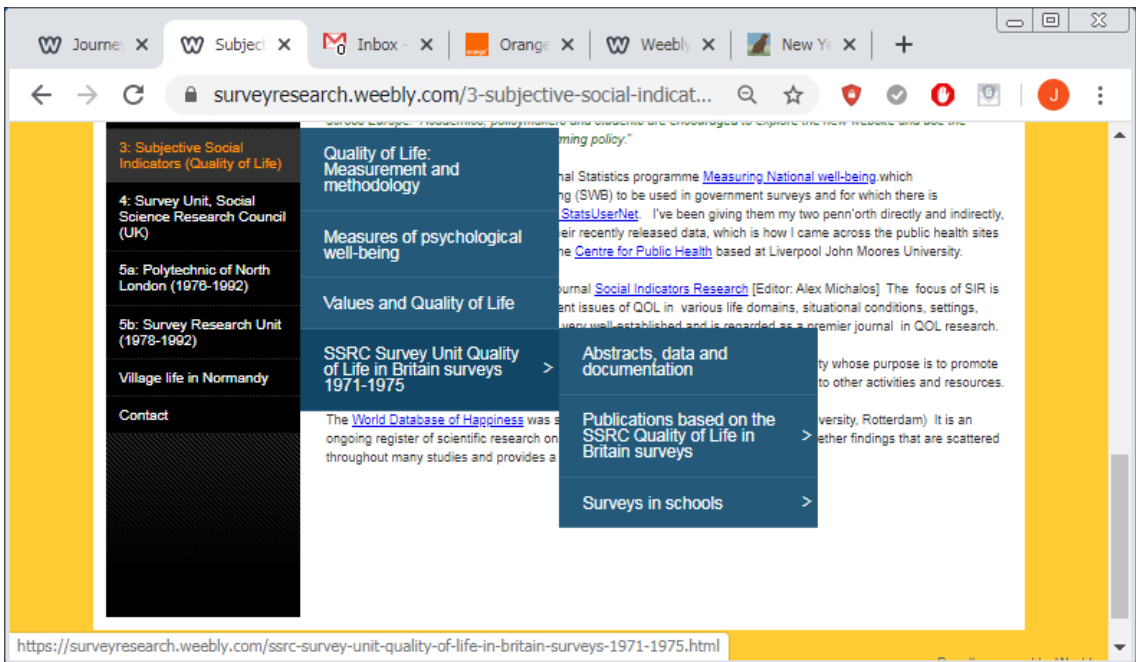

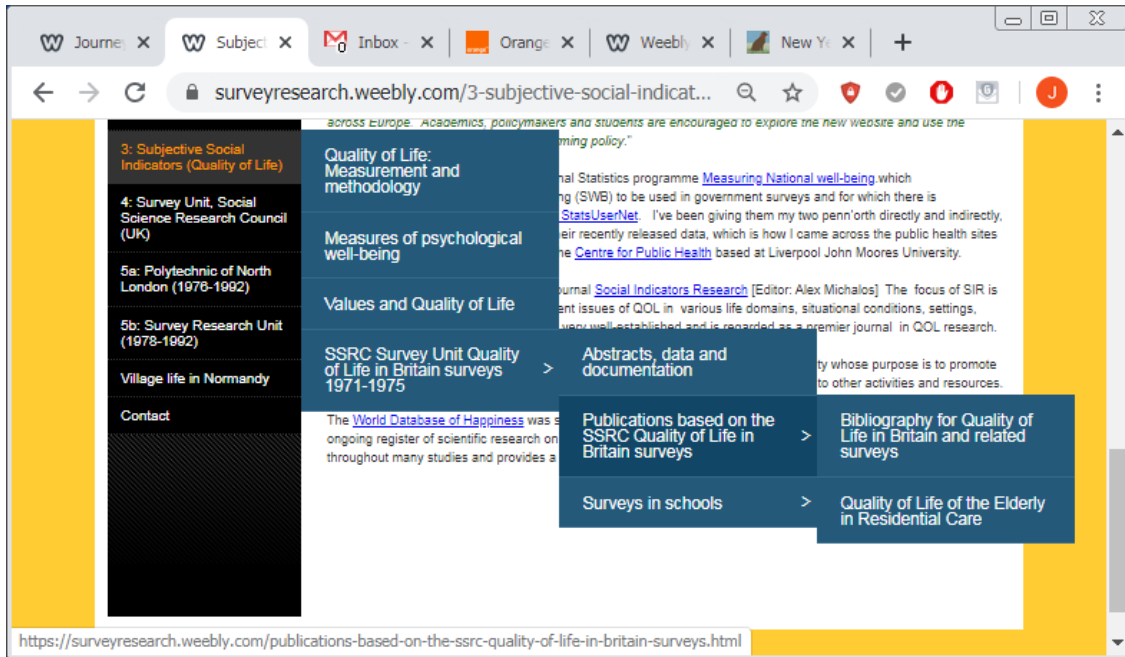

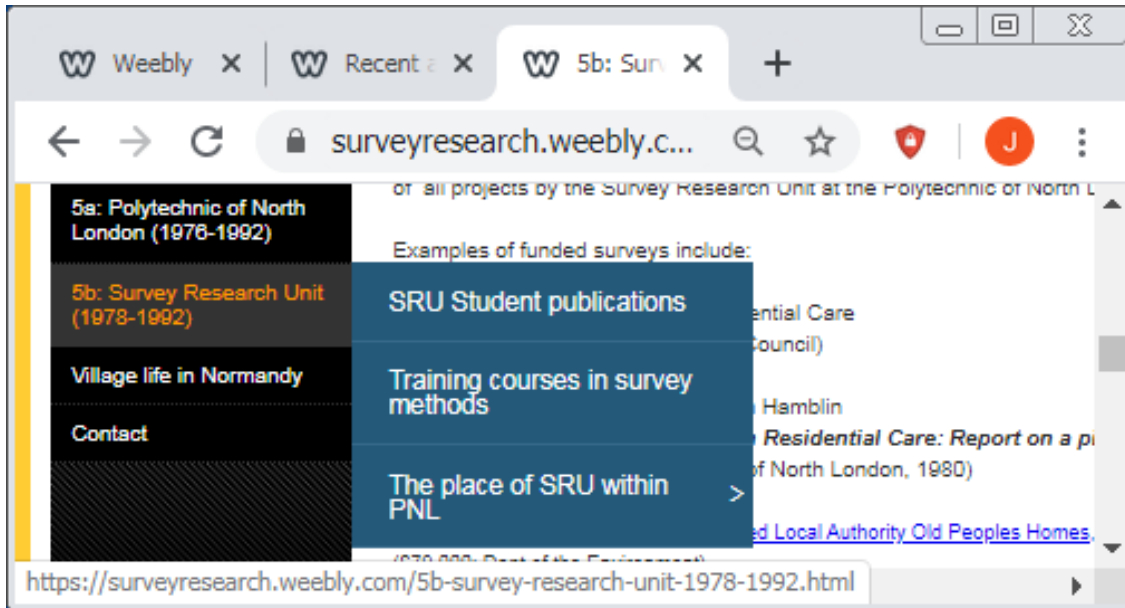

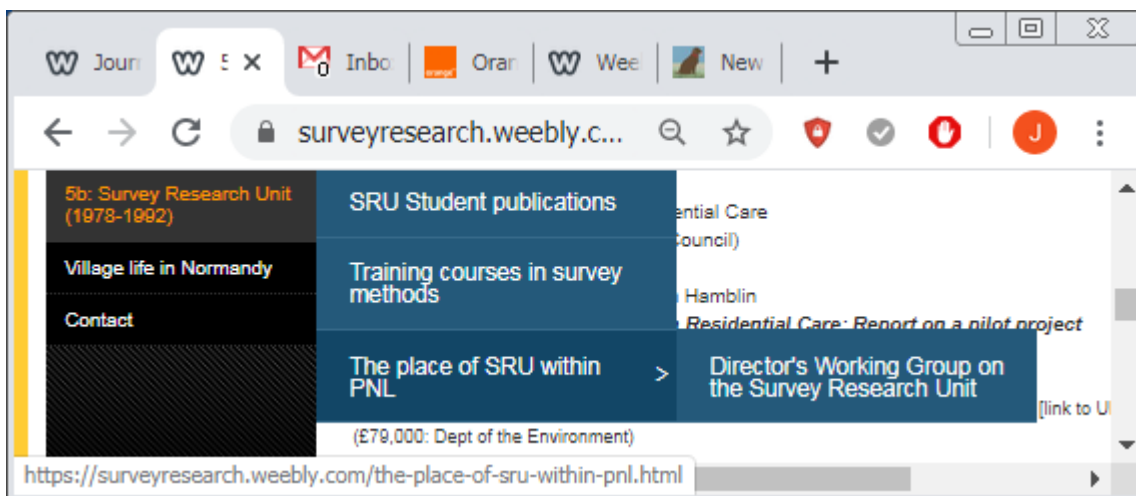

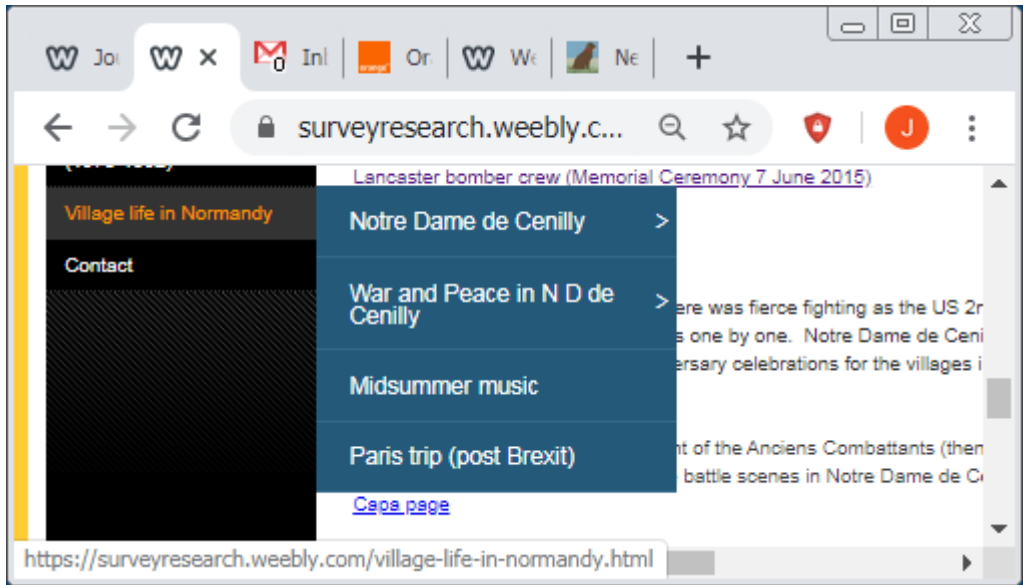

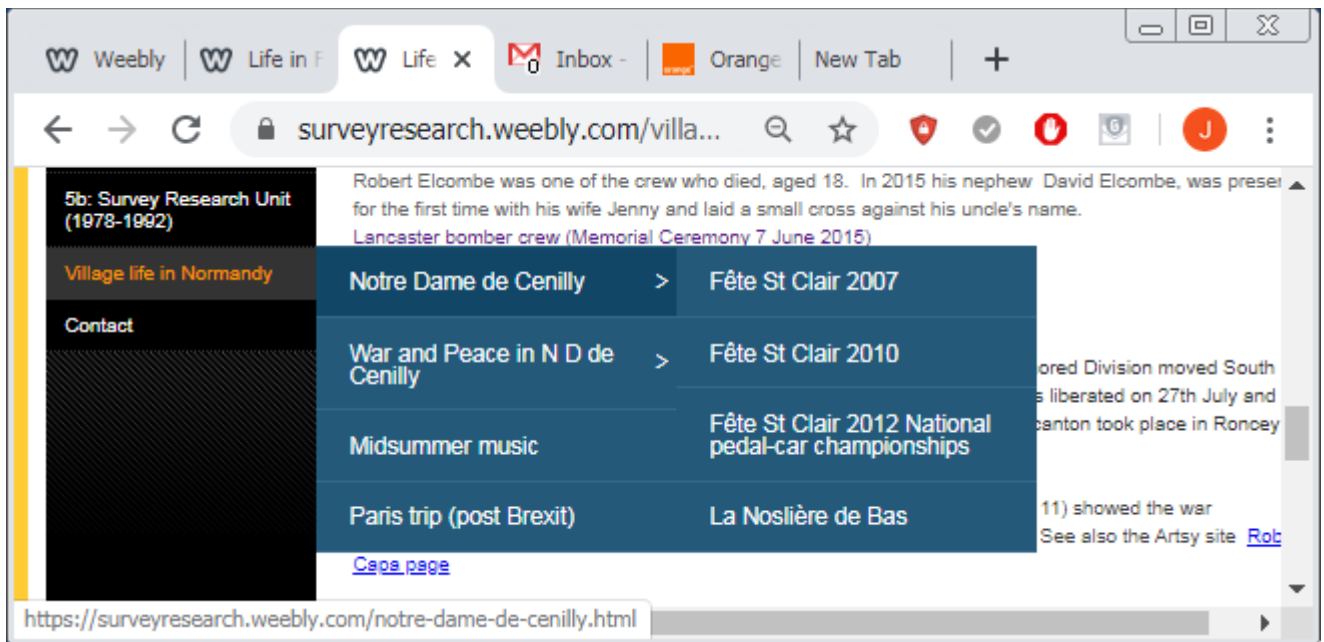

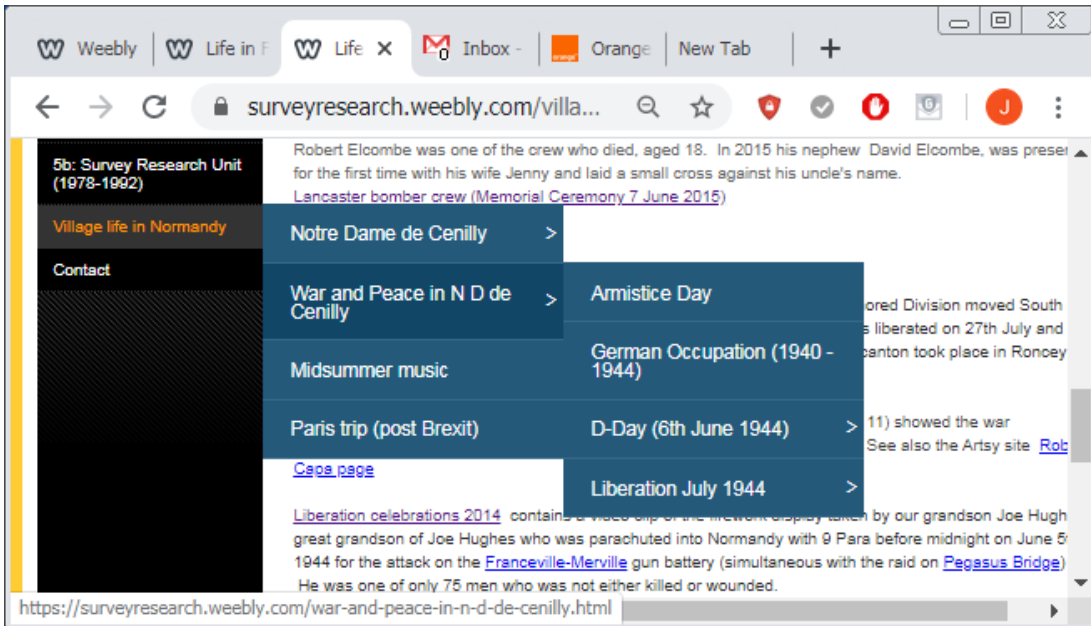

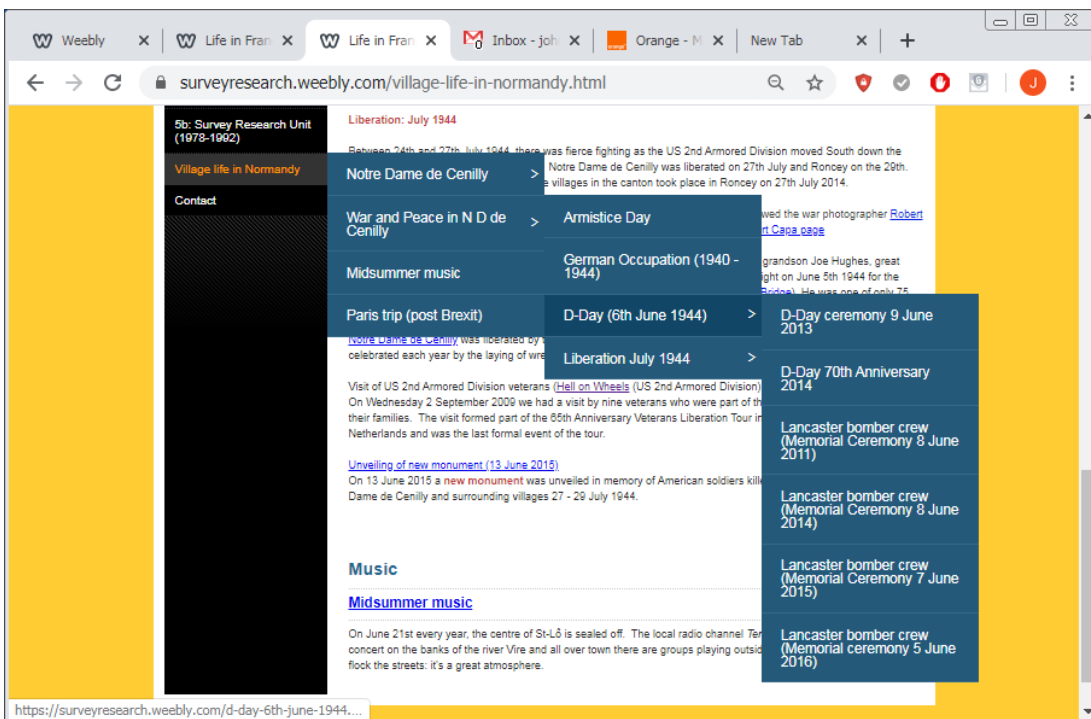
